Established in June of 2000 by Directors Cem and Elysabeth Catbas, Baltimore Ballet has presented professional ballet performances including our extremely popular, annual sold-out Nutcracker, as well as Les Sylphides, La Bayadere Kingdom of the Shades, Swan Lake Act 2, Giselle Act 2, and three ballets choreographed by Artistic Director Cem Catbas: Pictures at an Exhibition, Carnival of the Animals, and A Gershwin Rhapsody.

Baltimore audiences have had the pleasure of seeing world class dancers appear in our performances including stars of the Kirov Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, and Washington Ballet, among others.

surfaces, high ceilings & observation windows), a large waiting room and plenty of free parking. Wireless internet is available for students.

### **Founders and Directors:**

Cem Catbas is the Co-founder and Artistic Director of Baltimore Ballet. Originally from Istanbul, he studied on full scholarship at the Istanbul University State Conservatory with Ramazan Bapov (former Bolshoi Ballet Principal), Nikolia Morozov and Ludmilla Morkovina (of the Maly Theater in Russia), and received his B.F.A. in Dance with Distinction. He danced principal roles with the Istanbul Contemporary Ballet, and the Istanbul State Opera & Ballet (Romeo, Siegfried) under the direction of famed Cecchetti Master Richard Glasstone. He won the gold medal in the International Seleznyov Ballet Competition, and joined the Koblenz Ballet in Germany as a Principal Dancer. He then joined Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre where he danced the title role in Ben Stevenson's Dracula, the Monk in Kent Stowell's Carmina Burana, and numerous other Solo roles.

As Artistic Director and Principal Dancer of Baltimore Ballet, Cem Catbas has partnered famed ballerinas Evgenia Obraztsova (Kirov Ballet), Michele Wiles, Veronika Part, Stella Abrera (ABT), and others in his production of *The Nutcracker*. He danced Albrecht in *Giselle*, Siegfried in *Swan Lake*, Solor in *La Bayadere*, the lead male in *Les Sylphides*, and principal roles in the following ballets which he also choreographed: *Carnival of the Animals*, *Pictures at an Exhibition*, and *A Gershwin Rhapsody*.

He is a two-time winner of the MD State Arts Council Individual Artist Award for Solo Dance, was a guest judge for the Frederick Arts Council, and gives Master Classes in the US and Canada. He has appeared on WJZ-TV, ABC2 News, Comcast Newsmakers, and Baltimore Public Access. Cem Catbas' students have won 1<sup>st</sup> place at Youth America Grand Prix regional competition and numerous other competitions, have been accepted with scholarship to SAB summer program and year-round program, ABT, Kirov Academy, Walnut Hill, etc., as well as winning the MD Distinguished Scholar Award in dance and other full scholarships to Universities.

Elysabeth Catbas is Co-Founder and Managing Director of Baltimore Ballet, Chair of the Peabody Preparatory Voice Department, and Vice President of the National Association of Teachers of Singing MD/DC Chapter.
